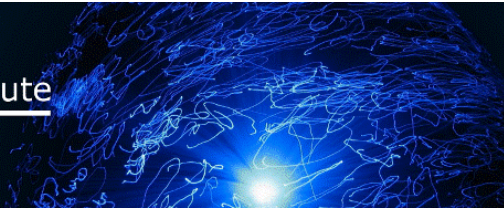

Bill Malcolm, Senior Legislative Representative, AARP

Bill Malcolm is a Senior Legislative Representative for AARP where he directs utility work for the Association, supporting states' efforts to advocate for fair and affordable utility rates. In July, he spoke twice at NARUC (on demand charges and on net metering issues). Bill has covered the Midwest (and Wisconsin) energy regulatory arena since 1994, first as a state regulatory manager for ANR Pipeline (an interstate gas pipeline serving Wisconsin) and then for MISO as one of its first employees. Bill helped create the state regulatory affairs program at MISO, the nation's first FERC-approved RTO.

Bill taught wholesale markets issues for the WPUI Energy Utility Basics course for 5 years and also was on the Board of the MSU Institute for Public Utilities where he also spoke for several years at CAMP NARUC. He recently spoke to the APPA Annual Meeting on a customer expectations' panel in Phoenix and was a keynote speaker in June to the National Energy Utility and Affordability Conference in Denver on the utility of the future. Bill also testified before the Michigan Senate Energy Committee in April on energy matters. He has also worked for PG&E where he helped link the low income rate to LIHEAP program administration.

A native of Madison, he attended Memorial High School and has a BA in economics from UC-Santa Cruz and a MA from the University of Washington. In his spare time, he serves on the Board of the Indiana Passenger Rail Association and writes for All Aboard Indiana (their newsletter).
