Her duties include developing, advocating, and implementing transmission policies and generation/supply/demand response strategies for MGE. She oversees MGE's primary MISO- and state-related resource adequacy responsibilities. Megan represents MGE in stakeholder meetings of the Midwest ISO, the PJM RTO,

Public Service Commission of Wisconsin, and the American Transmission Company. She has been active in MISO since the beginning (1999), when what is now known as the Market Subcommittee was the Congestion Management Working Group.
