As a scholar-practitioner with extensive federal government experience, Elisabeth is a public policy expert specializing in public sector institutional leadership and innovation, the science-policy interface, and contemporary models of public engagement. She has special interest in matters involving risk and rapid change. Her current focus is on energy system transitions and their complex intersections with political and cultural ideals, policy processes, market and legal institutions, innovation pathways, and governance of critical environmental resources. Since 2012, Elisabeth has filled many roles at Arizona State University. Currently, she is a professor of practice with the Consortium for Science, Policy and Outcomes; co-director of Energy Policy, Law and Governance with ASU-LightWorks; and a senior sustainability scientist with the Global Institute of Sustainability. She has been a visiting researcher at UW-Madison and has worked for several branches of the U.S. government, including the Geological Survey, the Department of the Interior, and Congress. In addition to her appointments at ASU, Elisabeth is an honorary fellow with the Center for Sustainability and the Global Environment at UW-Madison and a visiting scholar in various engineering programs at Michigan Technological University. She received an A.B. in politics from Princeton, an M.S. in agricultural economics from UW-Madison and a Ph.D. in environment and resources/public policy from UW-Madison.
