Clara Jeong is a toxicologist at the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WDHS) in the Bureau of Environmental and Occupational Health. She is responsible for investigating and assessing the potential for adverse health effects that may result from exposure to environmental hazards and for formulating recommendations for the reduction or prevention of unsafe exposures. She also serves as a technical resource to local, state, and federal partner agencies, as well as

the general public, responding to and addressing concerns and environmental hazards in their communities and jurisdictions. In addition, Clara assists with the development of statewide policy to address environmental contamination issues impacting public health. Prior to joining the WDHS, she was a postdoctoral trainee at the University of Wisconsin-Madison with a focus on understanding the mode of action of phthalates toxicity on androgen receptor regulated events in prostate cancer progression. Clara received her B.S. in chemistry at Korea University (Seoul, Korea) and M.S. in chemistry and Ph.D. in environmental toxicology at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Her dissertation focused on investigating cytotoxicity and genotoxicity of individual drinking water disinfection by-products (DBPs) in vitro as well as the toxicity of DBP mixtures in relation to epidemiological studies.
