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Robert Camfield is a senior regulatory consultant with extensive experience in the energy industry and the economics of regulation. Robert served as the program director for Edison Electric Institute's Transmission and Wholesale Markets summer program from 1999 through 2008. His professional work covers analysis underlying resource decisions, regulatory governance and incentive plans, market restructuring, regional analysis, cost allocation, time varying pricing, cost-benefit analysis and evaluation, and cost of capital and performance benchmarking. He testifies on a host of topics including rate of return, demand for electricity, resource planning, transmission congestion, wholesale power agreements, cost benchmarking and corporate performance, power procurement processes, electric and natural gas rate design, and regulatory phase-in plans. He negotiates power purchase agreements and transmission contracts, and assists utilities to determine OATT prices for regulatory filings. He manages formal solicitations for power supply, and he has developed commercial terms for contacts with renewable resources. Prior to joining CA Energy Consulting, Robert served as system economist for Southern Company and chief economist for the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission. He has published articles in *The Electricity Journal*, CIGRE (International Council on Large Electric Systems), IEEE Transactions on Power Systems, and contributed to *Pricing In Competitive Markets*, Kluwer Academic Publishers.
