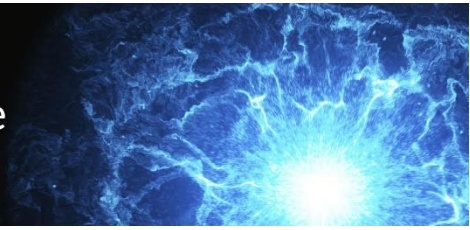

Sarah Hofmann was appointed to the Vermont Public Utility Commission (VPUC) by then-Governor Peter Shumlin in 2015. She serves on the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) board of directors, executive committee, telecommunications committee, and the subcommittee on nuclear waste disposal. Sarah also serves in many other capacities, including as chair of the Nuclear Waste Strategy Coalition (NWSC) and as a member the National Council on Electricity Policy (NCEP); the Federal-State Joint

Board on Jurisdictional Separations in Telecommunications; and the Interstate Telecommunications Relay Service Advisory Board. Prior to joining VPUC, Sarah was with the New England Conference of Public Utilities Commissioners (NECPUC), ultimately becoming its executive director in 2013. NECPUC provides regional regulatory assistance on matters of common concern to the six New England states. Prior to joining NECPUC, Sarah spent several years with the Vermont Department of Public Service, serving as special counsel; director for the Department of Public Advocacy, Consumer Affairs and Public Information; and becoming deputy commissioner in 2011. In her roles with that department, Sarah often directed the department's litigation, including matters before VPUC, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, and both federal and Vermont state courts. Sarah is a graduate of Rollins College and of the University of New Hampshire School of Law.
