Eric Callisto is a partner and a transactional practice group chair with the law firm of Michael Best & Friedrich LLP (MBF). Based in MBF's Madison, Wisconsin, office, Eric's practice focuses on energy, utility, and environmental matters. Prior to joining MBF, he was a commissioner on the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW), where he was also chairperson and previously chief of staff. In those roles, Eric ruled on the full range of critical matters coming before state regulators, including utility rate cases, certificates of need for large infrastructure projects, and disputes between stakeholders. During his tenure as PSCW chairperson, Eric led the organization through implementation of increases to the state's renewable portfolios standard, enhancements to the energy efficiency program, and the creation of wind siting standards. He has held key leadership positions in the Organization of MISO States (OMS), including serving as its president. As the head of the group of Midwestern utility regulators that advocates before Midcontinent Independent System Operator (MISO) and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), he helped OMS establish and advocate for positions critical to ratepayers in the MISO footprint. He testified multiple times before FERC and the MISO Board, with an emphasis on states' rights. He was also on the board of directors of the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners (NARUC) and was the chair of the NARUC international relations committee. Eric has held various positions within Wisconsin state government, including serving as assistant attorney general at the Wisconsin Department of Justice, head of the division of enforcement at the Department of Regulation and Licensing, and legal advisor to the then-Governor Jim Doyle. Additionally, Eric has worked as an environmental consultant and at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Eric received his J.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison and a B.A. in environmental sciences from the University of Virginia.
