Mark Thompson was appointed to the Oregon Public Utility Commission by Governor Kate Brown in November 2019 to a four-year term. Prior to his appointment, Mark was a partner at Sanger Thompson, a law firm that specializes in energy and administrative law, where he provided counsel and representation to energy project developers, utilities, energy consumers, and other businesses involved in energy. Prior to that, Mark worked as the senior director of rates and regulatory affairs at NW Natural Gas Company and as staff counsel for the Public Power Council, where he represented northwest consumer-owned utilities before the Bonneville Power Administration and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. Mark serves on the Oregon Broadband Advisory Council and the National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners committee on natural gas. He received a B.S. in conservation Biology from Brigham Young University and his law degree from Lewis and Clark Law School.
