

LISA SUBECK Wisconsin State Legislature

Lisa Subeck has represented Wisconsin's 78th State Assembly
District since January 2015. She serves on several committees,
including Assembly Organization; Campaigns and Elections; Energy
and Utilities; Health, Aging and Long-Term Care; Insurance; and
Rules. Additionally, she serves or has served on the Governor's
Council on Domestic Abuse; on the Speaker's Task Force on Foster
Care; on a legislative Study Committee on Access to Civil Legal

Services; as the Wisconsin state director for the National Foundation of Women Legislators (NFWL); and as an executive board member of the Women's Legislative Network of the National Conference of State Legislatures. Prior being elected to the State Assembly, Lisa served two terms on the City of Madison Common Council. As a council member, she successfully worked to bring much-needed services to vulnerable neighborhoods and helped expand access to public transit, improve public safety, and protect vital community services. She has served as executive director of United Wisconsin and as executive director of NARAL Pro-Choice Wisconsin. Lisa's career began in early childhood education. She worked for several years with the Head Start and Early Head Start programs and as an early childhood educator at Madison Area Technical College. She helped launch Hope House, a transitional housing program for young mothers of infants and toddlers. For many years, Lisa has worked to improve the lives of women and families, focusing on issues of poverty, homelessness, economic empowerment, and affordable housing. Her volunteer work has included Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Dane County, YWCA Racial Justice programs, Wisconsin Youth and Family Center, and Wisconsin Head Start Association. She has been active in state and local politics both personally and professionally for nearly 20 years, including serving as the Wisconsin State Chair for Democratic Municipal Officials. As a state legislator, Lisa remains a staunch advocate for social and economic justice as well as for access to affordable, quality early childhood education, protecting our environment, women's equality, and access to health care. She is a graduate of the Council on State Governments' Bowhay Institute for Legislative Leadership program and has been recognized for her legislative work as a Woman of Excellence by NFWL, as a Conservation Champion by the Wisconsin League of Conservation Voters, and as a Breastfeeding Advocate Award Winner by the Breastfeeding Council of South Central Wisconsin. Lisa received her B.A. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.
