Riley Allen was appointed to the Vermont Public Utility Commission (VPUC) by Governor Phil Scott in May 2021. Riley has over 30 years of experience analyzing and advising on power sector and regulatory issues. For more than two decades, he has played an active role in major state-level policy investigations, acting as an economist, expert witness, and hearing examiner.

Prior to becoming a commissioner with the VPUC, Riley worked for many years for the Vermont Department of Public Service. He filled various roles, including serving as deputy commissioner since 2017. Riley also spent many years working with regulators around the U.S. and overseas on telecommunications and power sector issues, largely associated with development agency-led initiatives. With the Regulatory Assistance Project, he was global research manager and an independent consultant, providing assistance to regulators around the world. Riley earned an MA in economics from the University of Virginia and a BA in economics from the University of Florida.
